

TOWN OF IRMO COUNCIL WORKSHOP January 5, 2021

The Irmo Town Council held a workshop on Tuesday, January 5, 2021 in the Municipal Building located at 7300 Woodrow Street, Irmo, SC 29063. Council members present were Mayor Walker, Councilwoman Condom, Councilmen Busch, and Sickinger. Councilman Danielson was absent. Others present were Mr. Robert Brown, Town Administrator, Police Chief Courtney Dennis, Mrs. Vi Racine, Municipal Clerk and Jake Moore, Town Attorney.

The agenda was published and posted on Thursday, December 31, 2020 to meet FOIA requirements.

Mayor Walker called the workshop to order at 7:00 P.M.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

A. Blue Granite Sewer / Feasibility Study / Application for DMA:

After a brief discussion about purchasing Blue Granite Sewer and issues such as billing, repairs, maintenance, and loan pay back, all of council agreed that the Town Attorney would obtain the documents from Blue Granite and/or the Public Service Commission and then solicit bids for an updated feasibility study.

B. Development Plan for Richland County property (9 acres / Friarsgate Blvd):

Mayor Walker stated there will be a Zoom Interest Meeting on Tuesday, January 12th at 6:30 P.M. regarding a Dog Park. Discussion included the need for water, bathroom facilities and maintenance. Mayor Walker expressed the interest of a Community Garden from the members of local chapter AKA Upsilon Omega Omega sorority and they were looking into possible grants and plan drawings.


C. Development Plan for Donated property (6 acres / Woodrow St):

Council agreed that a walking trail may be a workable idea since the topography of the 6 acres would be difficult to develop.

D. Open Discussion:

A presentation is scheduled for the January 17th council meeting. Mayor Walker stated there will be a Zoom Meeting on Monday, January 25th at 3:00 P.M. regarding the preservation of the Harbison Cemetery.
