

**TOWN OF IRMO
COUNCIL WORKSHOP
March 2, 2021**

The Irmo Town Council held a workshop on Tuesday, March 2, 2021 in the Municipal Building located at 7300 Woodrow Street, Irmo, SC 29063. Council members present were Mayor Walker, Councilwoman Condom, Councilmen Busch, Danielson and Sickinger. Others present were Mr. Robert Brown, Town Administrator, Police Chief Courtney Dennis, Mrs. Vi Racine, Municipal Clerk and Jake Moore, Town Attorney.

The agenda was published and posted on Friday, February 26, 2021 to meet FOIA requirements.

Mayor Walker called the workshop to order at 6:58 p.m.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

A. FY21/22 Budget (Staff)

Mayor Walker opened the discussion, and the items discussed included: hospitality tax, TORT increases, police vehicles and solid waste charges.

B. Irmo Community Clean-Up Event (Sickinger)

Mr. Sickinger gave an update stating about fifty (50) residents, fourteen (14) businesses and three (3) organizations were interested in helping with an Irmo Pride Clean-up Event early this spring.


C. Update on Blue Granite Sewer Purchase (Mayor)

Mayor Walker stated that Blue Granite Sewer had about 50 pump trucks working during the recent rainy weather event, and that type of costs could bankrupt the Town. Mr. Busch encouraged keeping pressure on Blue Granite Sewer by exploring options.

D. Open Floor Discussions


Mayor Walker asked if the Town has an ordinance to keep Comet passengers from standing on Town corners asking for money. He also stated that he would research how to offer Covid-19 vaccines in the Community Park. Mrs. Condom stated that an Augusta news team was at Town Hall asking about where Dustin Johnson Drive will be located.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further items to discuss, Mr. Busch made a motion to adjourn and Mr. Sickinger seconded it. The motion was approved unanimously; therefore, the workshop was adjourned at 8:03 p.m.
