Please Note:

- Events are held rain or shine but details are subject to change.
- To confirm details one week prior to events or if you have questions, go to <https://lex-co.sc.gov> – Departments – Solid Waste Management or call (803) 785-3340.
- Events are for Lexington County residents only (unless specified in event details). Material generated by businesses will not be accepted. Businesses may bring general recyclables, electronics and scrap metal to the Edmund Landfill.
- Volunteers are on site to help unload recyclables from vehicles as residents drive through the parking lot and stop at drop-off stations. Be prepared to show a driver's license or other proof of county residence.
- Limits are as follows: Up to 5 boxes/bags of paper, up to 8 electronics (small items and computer components are bundled to count as "one"), up to 8 gallons of liquid paint at HHW collections, and up to 2500 pounds solid and 300 gallons of liquids at pesticide collections. No limits on other items listed.
- Refrigerators and other appliances with Freon are not accepted at drop-off events. These may be brought to the Edmund Landfill by Lexington County residents (for \$15/item).
- Lexington County reserves the right to designate the end of the line using a vehicle and/or signs. In the event of excessive turn out, the end of line may be designated prior to the event end time to allow cars time to get through.
- All events are co-sponsored by the County of Lexington and Keep the Midlands Beautiful. Other organizations assist with one or more events each year including the Lexington County Stormwater Consortium, the SC Department of Agriculture, Lexington County 911 Communications, Richland County, the City of Columbia, the Town of Batesburg-Leesville, the Town of Irmo, the Riverbanks Zoo and Garden, and High School JROTC students from Batesburg-Leesville, Lexington, and White Knoll.



Please Note:

Up to 5 electronics are accepted per day for free from Lexington County residents at the Edmund Landfill, Mon-Sat 7 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Paint, when **completely dried** with sand or kitty litter may be placed in household garbage.
